Other interesting facts: Humpback whales have two blowholes, and their flippers are longer than all other whales. Flippers are scallop-shaped. They have notched tail flukes, and use their tales to lash out at predators (orcas). Strongly migratory, they feed along polar coasts in summer. They breed near tropical and subtropical coasts during winter. Humpbacks produce sounds to communicate, commonly called "singing." They live in groups.
